STUDENT AWARD PRIZE

STUDENT ENDORSER PRIZE

YOUNG AWARD PRIZE

Toro Young Student Greenkeeper of the Year Award winner will receive: a two-week all expenses paid work experience placement at the exclusive Vidauban Golf Club in the South of France, plus a trip to Continue to Learn at BTME and a Toro training voucher for a course of their choice.
